The Scientific Program Committee of ACOG 2011 invites all interested individuals to submit abstracts for oral or poster presentations. Abstracts on any topics relevant to women's health are welcome. **The deadline of abstract submission is Saturday, April 30, 2011.** On-line submission through the congress website www.aocog2011.org.tw is welcomed.

ABSTRACT REVIEW

Abstracts will be reviewed by the Scientific Program Committee and selected for oral or poster presentation based on the following criteria:

- Topics of general or local interest
- New research findings
- Use of new ideas and techniques in the field of Obstetrics and Gynecology
- Novel topics in the development of the relevant fields related to women's health

FORMS OF PRESENTATION

All abstracts should be submitted under either the "Oral" or the "Poster" options. For invited speakers, please choose "speaker presentation" while submitting the abstracts.

Oral Presentation

Selected abstracts for oral presentation will be presented at the congress according to the topic fields.

Poster Presentation

Some abstracts that are either chosen by the author to be presented in poster presentation or are not selected for oral presentation will be considered for poster presentation. This will allow presenters to discuss their research with other colleagues in the display areas.

Speaker Presentation

All the invited speakers are required to submit their abstracts through the online system.

GUIDELINES FOR ABSTRACT PREPARATION

1. Anyone who is interested in abstract submission should access the ACOG 2011 official website (www.aocog2011.org.tw) and submit abstracts on-line **no later than Saturday, April 30, 2011.**
2. If on-line submission is not available, please contact the Congress Secretariat (service@aocog2011.org.com). Your abstracts should be prepared according to the 'Typing Instructions'. For more information, please visit the Congress website (<http://www.aocog2011.org.tw>)

3. Acceptance to either oral or poster presentations is at the discretion of the Scientific Program Committee and notification will be sent to the presenting author by e-mail by **Friday, May 20, 2011**.
4. Upon acceptance of the abstract, authors are expected to register and to present their abstracts at Oral/Poster Presentations. Abstracts will be published in the congress abstract book only if at least one of the listed authors is officially registered with full payment no later than **Tuesday, May 31, 2011**.
5. After abstract submission, if there is any further modification, you will be charged USD 5 handling fee; the payment should be made upon your arrival.
6. Accepted abstracts will be included in a USB flash drive, exactly in the form and conditions submitted by the authors. Therefore, the authors are advised to strictly follow the typing instructions.
7. Please Note: Abstract(s) are accepted on the understanding that an author will attend to present the paper at the Congress.

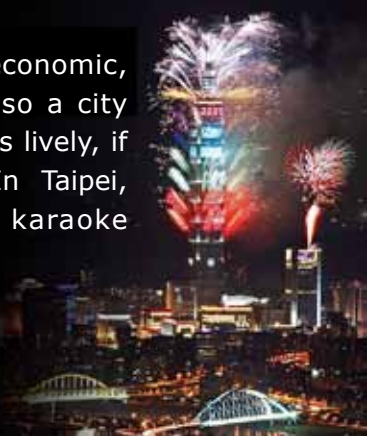
GENERAL INFORMATION

About Taiwan

Taiwan lies on the western edge of the Pacific “rim of fire”, and continuous tectonic movements have created majestic peaks, rolling hills and plains, basins, coastlines, and other wonders. Furthermore, Taiwan’s tropical, sub-tropical, and temperate climates provide clear differentiation between the different seasons, thus it owns abundant flora and fauna. That’s why when the Portuguese first landed on Taiwan, they said: “Formosa,” meaning, “beautiful (islands).” And it is just on account of the historical fusion of east and west on this island that makes Taiwan diverse with regard to landscape and cultural contour.

About Taipei

Taipei is Taiwan’s largest city as well as its economic, political, cultural, and fashion center. It is also a city which never sleeps. The nightlife of the city is as lively, if not more lively, when compared with daytime. In Taipei, 24-hour bookstores, restaurants, cinemas, karaoke parlors, and other places of cultural or leisure entertainment are providing visitors with a dynamic urban living experience. Furthermore, the prosperous 3C gadget market is the destination anyone visiting Taipei must go.



Visa of Entry

Foreign nationals may obtain tourist visas if holding foreign passports or travel documents valid for more than six months in Taiwan. 30-day visa-exempt or 90-day visa-exempt entries are applicable to citizens of 41 countries. Currency

Only New Taiwan Dollar (NTD) is acceptable at regular stands, stores and restaurants. Foreign currencies can be exchanged at government-designated banks, international airports, and hotels. The banking hour is 09:00-15:30, Monday-Friday.

Climate

Taiwan is located in the sub-tropical zone and encircled by sea, therefore the climate is with clear seasonal differentiation. Taipei as the host city, its temperature during the period of Congress in September ranges from 24-30 degree Celsius. For further weather forecast please refer to www.cwb.gov.tw

Insurance

Participants are encouraged to purchase travel insurance prior to their travel to Taiwan. Insurance policy typically covers accidental loss of belongings, medical costs in case of injury as well as illness, and other possible risks of international travel.

Dress Code

Smart casual attire is appropriate for meeting sessions. Dress for Welcome Reception is smart casual, and lounge suits are suggested for the President's Night as well as the Banquet. Aside from the official events, short sleeves, light waterproof jacket, and comfortable shoes are recommended for tour programs.

Electricity / Internet Access

Taiwan uses electric current of 110 volts at 60 cycles, and appliances from Europe, Australia or South-East Asia will need an adaptor or transformer. Many buildings have sockets with 220 volts especially for the use of air conditioners.

Taipei City Government proudly presents the WiFly application, which offers free access to wireless network, through all Xinyi District, and our Congress venue, TICC and TWTC are encompassed in this area.

Tippling and Tax

Tips are not necessary anywhere in Taiwan, while 10% service charge would normally be included in the bill. In addition, VAT(value-added tax) refund is available in the airport, thus visitors should collect receipts and VAT refund form while shopping.

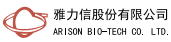
